

# From the Pastor's Desk

We're in the middle of a sermon series about the mission of the church. Earlier this year, we shared with you the mission statement that our church council felt reflects First United Methodist Church:

Our mission is to make disciples of Jesus Christ and share the love of God in word and deed

We've begun having some interesting discussions in church council and in our various committee meetings about aligning our ministries to help us complete this mission. One recent realignment was a change in what happens on Easter Sunday for children. This year, each child got to learn about the colors of faith and create a cross necklace, so that they will always remember the story of Jesus - much different than finding eggs and getting prizes.

Our mission tells us what we are to be doing as a church; our vision gives us a picture of what our church will look like in the future. The church council has spent lots of time praying together about God's vision for our congregation, and in April, they arrived at this vision:

First United Methodist Church will be a congregation seeking after the very heartbeat of God.

Our physical location has placed us at the center of Crawford County and the city of Robinson.

We will be God's heartbeat in the center of the city.

All of our ministries will focus on the heartbeat of God, helping people follow Jesus Christ, and listening to the Holy Spirit to heal the hearts of the least and the lost.

What kind of church would First United Methodist Church be if we sought to make this vision a reality? As we reflected on this vision, members of the church council began to speak of ways that we could carry out this vision - with our children in Kids' Club, with students in Refresh, in the jail ministry, within the local schools, for people with addictions, and those that are hurting. The possibilities of strengthening our existing ministries and creating new ones that help the church be God's heartbeat, move people to follow Jesus, and heal broken hearts are endless.

What might God be calling you to do to make this vision become a reality? I hope you'll join in praying with and for the church council as we continue to discern what's next for First UMC!



### Gare News from Stephen Ministry

We've been talking about Stephen Ministry at First UMC for over a year now. We will be sending Janelle Oxford, Marcia Schmidlin, Janis Daugherty, and Pastor Jay to Stephen Leader training in Orlando this June. Please pray for them! In the meantime, Stephen Ministry isn't idle! If you need someone to pray with you, Stephen Ministers are available in the chapel 15 minutes prior to and after the 9:00 am worship service each Sunday. Also, our Stephen Ministers have been reaching out to those in our congregation and community who have been going through times of grief and loss. We're seeking to heal broken hearts, one person at a time.

Stephen Ministry provides one-on-one care to persons who are experiencing life transitions and major life moments. Because the care is one-on-one, each Stephen Minister will only be assigned one person to journey with at a time, and they are assigned to a person of the same gender. Right now, we only have three male Stephen Ministers, and we could use some more. If God has placed it on your heart to walk with people during a difficult time in their life journey, please contact one of the Stephen Leaders listed above.



One of the first questions you may wonder is how did Stephen Ministry get its name. In the book of Acts, Stephen was chosen to provide caring ministry to those in need. Since the time of the Apostles, caring ministry has been considered a hallmark of the Christian faith community. The Stephen Ministry logo also captures the essence of this care ministry. The Stephen Ministry logo represents a care receiver's journey from brokenness toward wholeness through the cross of Jesus. In this way, it illustrates "Christ caring for people through people," which is the Stephen Ministry motto. Stephen Ministers walk beside another who is going through a difficult time. God works through Stephen Ministers as they listen, pray, and encourage their care receivers. Stephen Ministers are available for prayer each Sunday after worship in the Chapel.
