And, if none of those times work, but you still want to help in some way, please contact Kirbie in the church office. There are many projects that need volunteer time and attention, but can be done based on volunteer availability (double-bagging plastic bags, sorting clothing, sorting donations, etc.). Pray about how God might be calling you to serve with NOW in 2018.



CALLED TO WRITE?

Yes, it's only January, and we're just getting ready to finish the season of Christmas; however, Lent begins February 14, and Scriptures are now available for First UMC's Lenten devotional. As many of you have experienced by now, we produce a daily devotion during the seasons of Advent and Lent. Devotions aren't long at all (1-2 paragraphs, with a short prayer), and are distributed as a printed devotional book, as well as a daily e-mailed devotion. If you feel like God has been gently nudging you to write a devotion, please sign up at the welcome center. And, if you don't feel called to write, but feel that you have the time to edit the devotions once they are received (and before they are printed), please contact the church office.

"I WANT TO SERVE, BUT...
