# From the Pastor's Desk

Well, here we are...just this past week, I remarked to someone that we thought COVID would be over by Easter, and that we'd only be apart for 3-4 weeks. How wrong we were about that prediction! These ensuing months have caused us to feel a myriad of emotions - anger, frustration, depression, loneliness, to name a few. As much as we have wanted things to go back to pre-COVID, God has - and is - using this time to refine us. We've had to question whether we live in scarcity or abundance. We've wondered if we can embrace a schedule and calendar that actually has "white space" on it. We've been pushed to determine if the church is centered around people or a building.

And now, here we are. For some of us, Thanksgiving looked - well, unusual. Christmas promises to not be the same as it used to be. And here we are...in Advent. These days prepare us for the coming of Christ. These days invite God to refine us - to filter out the impurities of our lives - and, as the carol says, "let every heart prepare him room."

I would venture to say that, as hard as these last eight months has been, the church has never needed Advent more than it does in 2020. People of faith really need this time for reflection, for prayer, for recognizing what is truly important in our lives (and to realize that our lives of faith are not separate from every other aspect of our lives). Imagine what would happen if we released bitterness from our hearts, or anger, or pain, or sorrow - and we let Jesus Christ take their place? That, my friends, is what incarnation means - God coming down and taking up residence in our hearts.

So, watch and wait with me. Pray with me. Use Kay Albin's wonderful poetry as a starting place, alongside the daily Scripture readings in our Advent devotional. Invite God to refine you through them. Gather with us online (or in person) for worship, for Sunday school, or even for some wonderful live-streamed music from our sanctuary (like the LTC music faculty recital on December 9 at 7:00 pm!; for our Kids' Club families - assemble your Lego Advent wreath kits and light your candles with us each Sunday morning for worship. Watching and waiting gives us the opportunity to get ready for the greatest gift of all - Jesus Christ. He is our hope and our peace.
