

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I was fortunate to be at Jurisdictional Conference this past month when our new bishop, Frank J. Beard, was elected to the episcopacy. Bishop Beard joins the Illinois Great Rivers Conference in September. I was in the room the evening he was elected, and was able to hear his address to the conference. In it, he shared that his first experience with the church was being invited by the pastor to come in for Kool-aid and cookies after an evening of VBS...and then he was invited to come back for VBS the next night...and he did. He said that church nurtured him in faith. He went to VBS, and they sent him to church camp, and they helped him grow his faith.

I have long-standing memories of my Sunday school teachers – Marilyn and Carol, in particular – who loved me into faith. I remember pastors who baptized and confirmed me (I was and older child when I was baptized). I remember summers of VBS, where we met in tents as tribes of Israel, and the kitchen ladies would bring us trays full of cookies and glasses of cold Kool-aid. I remember discussions in youth ministry that changed my life, alongside the members of the church who served as our sponsors. I recall mission trips that forever changed the way I looked at the world. Many times, my faith was nurtured by my involvement in Bible studies, in Wesley Foundation campus ministries, and by gathering for worship and prayer.

I'm very aware that we have people in our congregation at all points of their faith journey. Some feel that they get all that they need to grow simply by attending worship. Others see Sunday school as an integral part of their faith. Still others seem to be hungry for that nurturing and sign up for every single Bible study and small group that's offered.

This month, students head back to school. Some of our students will head off to college, trade school, or the military, and your household dynamics will change. Some of your routines will change as students (or you) head back into the classroom. Our ministries will change as well. I want to encourage you to read this month's newsletter for an eye on the ways in which you can take a step forward to have your faith nurtured. Hear the stories of others who have seen what a difference Christian formation has made to their faith and life. Consider how God might be calling you to grow.

LEARNING & TEACHING: MY LIFELONG JOURNEY

As I sit down to reflect on what Sunday School & Disciple Bible study mean to me, I struggle with where to even begin. I cannot imagine my life without either one, as they both have had profound impacts on my faith. One quote that I came across read "I want to stop thinking of reading my Bible as an item on my Christian checklist and really experience God instead." As a school teacher, I frequently assign textbook reading in order for my students to be prepared and allow for us to cover all of the material necessary each semester. Though they may grumble at the thought of reading, it is imperative for them to spend time trying to sift through the information individually so that they become personally familiar with the concepts. Isn't being a Christian the same? The Bible is God's intimate letter to each of us. It contains all of his guidelines and instructions for this life. It is our hope and strength for navigating this world. It is his love letter to every one of us. How do we know what it says or what we believe if we don't spend quality time becoming personally familiar with it?

Just as with any other area of life, becoming familiar with God's word takes discipline. It is so much easier if we have partners in the journey to encourage us to stick with it and give insight into each scripture. Those of us who have participated in Disciple often joke that our lives seem out of sorts or lack structure when we take a week off or are between studies. I look forward to fellowship each week with the others in class and hearing how God has spoken to each of them through their reading of the same scriptures and the life experiences they have each had. None of us are experts on scripture, but we are all humans seeking God's love in our life. I think it is absolutely fascinating to listen to each person speak about their individual walk through life and perspectives on Jesus. It touches my heart and helps me to hear God's voice in a new way. I firmly believe that wisdom is all around us, if we simply take the time to listen.

Each week as part of Disciple Bible Study, we examine a statement entitled Our Human Condition, because after all we are human and daily fall short of the glory of God. The final week's study of Disciple II was about Ordering Our Lives Around God and taking time daily and weekly to focus on our relationship with him. The Human Condition statement said: "Mostly I put me first. Each new decision becomes a crisis; I feel pushed and pulled in all directions. I spend my time doing the immediate and put off the important. So often my life seems off balance." I know that without making a conscious effort to include Bible study in my daily life, this statement comes true all too often for me. If it also speaks to you, I highly encourage you to go out on a limb and join a new group or study which will allow you to explore your faith more deeply. There are lots of fantastic opportunities to learn and grow here at First United Methodist Church. I am absolutely certain that your life will be richer for having done so.

UPCOMING STUDIES AT FUMC


Sunday School

Sunday school classes meet weekly at 10:15 am. Beginning in September, we'll embark on an all-church study called "First/Shiny Gods" by Mike Slaughter. Each age group (children through adults) will be studying this videobased serious for the month. Daily devotion books during this study will be available for purchase (\$6). For the rest of the school year, all age groups will be studying "The Story," which gives us a grand sweep of the Biblical story. All these studies are easily "drop-in" studies, which means you can attend when you're able, but not feel like you can't keep up if you need to be gone.

Disciple III

Our Disciple III class will begin in September! Tuesday evening classes will be offered from 6:00-8:00 pm, (childcare provided) beginning September 6. Thursday morning classes will be offered from

9:30-11:30 am, beginning September 8. This 32week study will take us through the prophets and the letters of Paul. The cost of materials is \$40, and you can sign up at the welcome center.
