
Second Wednesday Dinner




Christian Book Exchange

Life Transitions

Julie and her husband had made plans. Because their children were grown and living on their own, the couple would retire and take the extended vacations they had talked about for many years. Then Julie's life was turned upside down in a series of "lifequakes" (lifequake - a forceful burst of change in one's life that leads to a period of upheaval, transition, and renewal). The transitions hit her one after the other. They began when Julie turned in her official notice to retire, and three months later her husband served her with divorce papers after 29 years of marriage. A few weeks later Julie's sister was diagnosed with stage 4 cancer, and Julie became her caregiver. Julie's sister moved in with Julie, and Julie's adult son lost his job in a corporate downsizing and took up residence in the basement. The ten year old SUV needed four new tires, and the roof was leaking. And then,......

The Stephen Ministers recently participated in a continuing education session on "life transitions". One resource was Life is in the Transitions: Mastering Change at Any Age, written by Bruce Feiler. Over the course of several years, Feiler traveled to all 50 states where he collected hundreds of life stories and compiled data. Feiler says that our ability to master the skills to face and deal with transitions in our lives is important and urgent. His insights provide specific strategies we may use to reimagine and rebuild our lives. To learn more about facing and dealing with "lifequakes", check out Bruce Feiler's book from the Stephen Ministry Library.
