Pastor's Pen

Dear friends.

As a follow-up to last month's insert on worship planning, I wanted to share with you a couple of thoughts on communion. I have heard (mostly via the grapevine) that some of us are uncomfortable with the sanitary nature of communion. I want to suggest that there is no perfectly sanitary way for us to receive communion. Whether we all dip our bread into one cup and run the risk of a couple of people dipping their fingers in the cup, or having people touch 4-5 cups as they try to grasp an individual cup, there is always a possibility that germs are spread. The same is true for picking up a piece of cut bread from a pile or tearing off a piece of bread from a loaf others have touched.

We are trying to make communion as sanitary as possible. Communion servers are using hand sanitizer before serving to clean their hands. Rather than having everyone touch the loaf, the servers are the only ones who touch it, and they are tearing off a piece of bread that is big enough that no one's hands should touch. When we serve communion in this way, we are coming the closest to historical practice and theology – one bread and one cup.

We want to help you – so if you need assistance receiving communion or need it brought to your seat, please let one of the ushers or servers know.
