I was recently reading Gregson's book, *Miracle in the Mundane* which I highly recommend, and in the chapter, "A Change is

Gonna Come", he paints the picture of being balanced between two worlds and how voices are calling out to him. 5K Your Way






Christian Book Exchange

He shares helpful insights about grief and biblical Each book focuses on what truths. the person is likely to be experiencing at that point in grief—offering understanding, empathy, compassion, and hope. These books can be a powerful way for you to personally offer sustained comfort and compassion to a relative, friend, neighbor, or coworker who is grieving.

Book 1: *A Time to Grieve* . . . sent 3 weeks after the loss

Book 2: *Experiencing Grief* . . . sent 3 months after the loss

Book 3: Finding Hope and Healing . . . sent 6 months after the loss

Book 4: Rebuilding and Remembering
... sent 11 months after the loss
