### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

For the past several years, as November rolls around, I see a number of my friends making posts on social media, posting once per day about something for which they give thanks. Thanksgiving Day occurs earlier in November this year, and many people will only post for 22 days. I enjoy seeing those posts, but I wonder if we do ourselves a disservice by only making November a time of focused Thanksgiving.

Recently in Disciple Bible study, I was talking about the practice of contemplative prayer. I suggested that the practice of the examen could help us. Traditionally, the examen begins by reflecting on where you've seen God at work throughout the day (we do this practice at night), and where we've inhibited God's work. The examen is simultaneously thanksgiving/praise and self-reflection/confession.

I want to encourage you, this month, to make the examen a part of your evening routine. To do so, ask this question: what am I thankful for today? Give praise to God for those things. A follow-up question might be: what can I do to turn other circumstances today into opportunities to be thankful tomorrow? Studies tell us that it takes at least 18 days to form a habit; if you begin this practice on November 1, by Thanksgiving, it could be a habit that you could continue throughout the year.

We have so much to be thankful for at First United Methodist Church, and I hope you'll take time this month to read through some of the things that we're thankful for, as well as some opportunities to give thanks. I hope you'll join us for one (or more) of them.

I'll start the list of things we're thankful for: I'm thankful for all of you, for the opportunity to serve in ministry with you, and for your expressions of appreciation during Pastor Appreciation Month. Your generosity inspires me to be more generous with my time, talents, and resources.

# THE FIELDS ARE RIPE FOR THE HARVEST

As we enter the month of November, we're about to complete the second year of our capital campaign. We know that the fields are ripe for the harvest, and that First UMC continues to move into the future boldly, sharing the love of Jesus Christ in tangible ways. Our church is reaching more people all the time! As you know, we've undertaken three projects in this capital campaign. We completed the first project within the first six months - purchasing and demolishing the apartment building next door - and we are poised for future growth and building expansion.

We're almost two years into our second project - paying off our debt (\$249,000). As of the end of October, we've paid \$158,805.41 toward the principal, and our loan balance is \$91,651.70. While this is great news, we anticipate only another \$63,000 in pledges in 2019, which leaves us at a balance of \$28,000+ on our loan. We encourage you, if you have not yet made a pledge or gift to the capital campaign, to do so. Pledge cards are available at the display table in the narthex. And, if you're already making a gift and would like to give beyond your original pledge, you're welcome to do so! Together, we can do this, and move on to our third project - expanded parking!

## TRUSTEES UPDATE

In an effort to be kinder to our facilities and create a safer environment for our students, the trustees will be making some changes to room assignments. To help ease stress on the elevator and volunteers, the NOW Program will be relocating to the main floor, utilizing the storage room and stage in Asbury Hall. The area will be secure, but will enable our volunteers and staff to better serve people who need assistance. In addition, there has been concern for some time about the safety of our students, whose classroom on the third floor has no escape. The students will be moving to room 2103 (where Faith and Friends Sunday school class has been meeting), and the adult class will temporarily move to the library. We will be repurposing the old NOW storage room as an additional classroom space in anticipation of our continued growth. Look for these changes happening throughout November! Thanks be to God for our continued growth in ministry!

Also, the trustees are hoping to complete several projects before the end of the year. They are seeking bids to do repair work on the education wing entrance, to repair the leak in the bell tower, and to purchase materials to finish the ceiling in the basements. Preliminary estimates place costs of these items at \$20,000+. While the trustees have money in their budget lines to cover the bulk of this work, our operating fund is at a deficit this year. If you would like to contribute to help us complete these projects, we would be forever grateful!
