As the month of August brings many of our schedules back into a sense of normalcy and routine, we invite you to explore the pages of this newsletter to find out ways that you can get into gear with First UMC and your faith.

From the Pastor's Desk

Where has the time gone? When did a year pass by? It was just a year ago that I was moving my belongings into the parsonage on Scott Drive and unpacking boxes in my study. So much has happened in this past year, as we've been working together to build a foundation of trust, dynamic worship, and gathering around Scripture together. Should we sit back and rest and take stock in all that God has accomplished in and through us? While we celebrate some major shifts in our financial outlook, a completed building project, increasing worship attendance and participation in Bible studies, thriving ministries for children and youth, and new outreach ministries, we are just getting started.

Whatever shift you make, may it bring you closer to God, and help our congregation continue to move forward to growth and wholeness.



Want to deepen your faith this year? Get in gear by signing up for one of these classes this fall:


Disciple II is a 32-week Bible study that focuses on Genesis, Exodus, Luke and Acts. We are offering two opportunities to participate in this study. The first is on Tuesday nights, beginning September 8, from 6:00-8:00 pm. The Tuesday night session will be held at Otterbein UMC, as several of their members will also be joining us. There will be a second session on Thursdays from 9:30-11:30 am, beginning September 10. The cost for materials is \$40. If you are interested, please sign up at the welcome center by August 23, so that we can make sure you have materials before your first class. Childcare is available upon request.





Serving from the Heart is a three-hour session on spiritual gifts. Do you know your spiritual gifts? How can you use them. These simple sessions are free, and you get materials where you discover your spiritual gifts and other important lessons about yourselves. If you're interested in participating, our next sessions are August 16 from 1-4 pm; September 12 from 9 am-noon; and September 13 from 1-4 pm. We appreciate if you can sign up ten days ahead of time in the welcome center, so that we can be sure to have enough materials for you. Childcare is available upon request.

Earn. Save. Give. is an all-church study that we will be doing in September. Our worship services will be based around these themes from Wesley's sermon on money and stewardship. As part of our time on Sunday mornings, our Sunday school classes for all ages will be studying this same material. Written by James Harnish (who authored the study *A Disciple's Path*, which we did during Lent), children, youth and adults will look at these themes and Scriptures together. You don't have to sign up to take part in the study, but please feel free to visit different classes, particularly if you've never been a part of Sunday school before, and see what class might be a good fit for you. Then, after this study concludes at the end of September, you're encouraged to continue in your class.



Helping Kids Get in Gear

August 10 and 11 the NOW program is offering its 1st annual Back to School Shopping Day. This is a new extension of the NOW program. The Back to School Shopping Day will offer the students an opportunity to choose a couple of new or gently used outfits to begin the new school year. They will also receive new socks, new underwear, and new tennis shoes, in addition to, toiletries and some school supplies.

Much like the weekend food section of the NOW program, the Back to School program is carried out in many surrounding counties. Wabash and Lawrence County have had these programs in place for several years. Lawrence County serves over 600 students annually at their shopping day. During a worship service at Parkside Church in Mt. Carmel, the leader for their Back to School Shopping Program made a statement that struck my heart... giving these students this opportunity allows them to walk in to school on that first day with a little bit of dignity.

What an awesome service to provide these students! A chance to be bright and shiny on the first day of school, just the same as their peers. What an awesome service to provide the parents/guardians of these students!! Relieving them of the enormous cost and burden of purchasing back to school clothing and shoes.
