Laundry Day Quarter Collection



Care News From Stephen Ministry

The Stephen Ministry team continuously looks for ways to provide the best care they can for their care receivers. Therefore the Stephen Ministry ministers and leaders access the needs of their care receivers and base the team's continuing education on those needs. Continuing education helps Stephen Ministers to continue to hone and develop additional caregiving skills.

Robinson FUMC Stephen Ministry team identified a need to learn more about providing care for people going through health challenges and those dealing with grief. So, hospice care was identified as a continuing education topic. Hospice is "an allencompassing philosophy of patient care. It is a unique approach in which the patient and family, not the disease, are the focus."

Recently the Robinson FUMC Stephen Ministry team hosted three representatives from Good Samaritan Hospice: Jamie Krobger, Emily Query, and Trevor Murray. Jamie and Emily are social workers, and Trevor is the chaplain for Good Samaritan Hospital and GM Hospice. They shared information on the services they provide: medical care, nursing care, 24-hour assistance, home health services, emotional and spiritual support, general and bereavement counseling, social work services, grief

support groups and grief education, medications for comfort care, medical supplies, durable medical equipment, dietary counseling, physical, occupational and speech therapy, and trained volunteers. They also shared several of their resources for providing emotional care to people and their family going through health challenges. The Stephen Ministers were impressed by the hospice care providers' compassion for others and their passion for their professions.
